The majority of the collection is held at the Central library. We can arrange for a book to be brought to your local library.

How to use a library -

You need to join the Library before you can use the computers or borrow books. Joining the library is free. Bring proof of your address e.g. letter, medical card, or bring your Home Office document. With the card you can borrow up to **12 items**, e.g. books, CDs, videos and DVDs.

You can borrow books for three weeks. It is important to return books by the date stamped in front of the book so other people can read them. If you want to keep them for longer, unless someone else has reserved the items, you can extend the loan by phone, online, or in any of the libraries.

The best way to find an item is to look for it on NeLib, the library catalogue. You can access this using computer in the library or via the Internet. Library staff will be happy to show you how to use it if you are unsure.

It may be possible to arrange home delivery for customers who cannot leave home due to health reasons.

Libraries are fun places where you can find out information, borrow books, learn languages and get other help. They are available for all to use.

In a library you will find -

- **Books** - both stories and factual on a wide range of topics; books in different languages for adults and children, including dual language books; dictionaries in 80 languages. If the book you want to read is not available please ask staff for help.
- **DVDs, videos and CDs** on music of all types and from different countries, and a wide range of films, both educational and entertainment.
- Free access to **Computers**, the **Internet**, and a range of software.
- A range of **newspapers and magazines**, including papers from other countries.
- **Language study materials** including books, tapes, CDs and CD-ROMs to help you learn English and other languages.
- **Information and help** on a range of subjects about community activities, everyday life in Nottingham and its heritage.
- **Cultural events, exhibitions, book presentations, and story**
