Here are some examples of the projects gifts in Wills could make possible, and the ways your gift could make an important contribution in the future.



Specialist Advice

We provide specialist advice to people seeking safety who are facing some of the toughest moments of their lives. Many are homeless, survivors of abuse, LGBT+, or families with no recourse to public funds. We walk with them through complicated systems, helping them overcome barriers to achieve fair outcomes and rebuild their lives with **dignity** and hope.

Community Café

By running Café Narjis, we've created a warm, welcoming place where people from all backgrounds can share food, connect and feel at home. The hot, nutritious and culturally familiar meal which serves up to 100 people a day is a lifeline for many seeking refuge. Our volunteers, many with lived experience, cook with care, share their traditions and help people feel like they're not alone.



Grassroots Community Garden

Our Grassroots Community Garden is a warm, friendly place where clients, volunteers and local people can meet, talk and feel part of a community. For volunteers with lived experience, being in the garden brings purpose, routine and confidence, and is a therapeutic space. As well as growing flowers, fruit and vegetables for our café, the garden hosts Refugee Week BBQs, pizza nights, art classes and yoga.

Pamoja Women's Group

"For ten years, our weekly group has been a place where women can learn new skills, grow in confidence and imagine new possibilities for themselves. Women join us for everything from seaside trips to creative sessions with independent artists. Most of all, the group offers a safe, friendly space to relax, connect and feel they belong. It helps women seeking safety build friendships, ease anxiety and enjoy new opportunities together with plenty of smiles, laughter and support along the way.



How one women's legacy helped provide compassion to refugees

Joan was a valued ESOL teacher and volunteer at Nottingham Refugee Forum and left a substantial gift to us in her Will.

Like so many of our supporters, Joan was deeply passionate about welcoming everyone who had fled their homes and were seeking safety in Nottingham. Joan loved spending time in the classroom, helping students practise their English – both in group settings, alongside other tutors, and also individually. She was always energetic, witty and kind. She never missed a class, was loved by her students, and is dearly missed by all of us at Nottingham Refugee Forum.

In her memory, Joan's legacy now supports our project for refused asylum seekers, helps our café serve over 13,000 meals each year, and keeps our garden welcoming more than 100 clients annually.

Individuals and families seeking refuge will benefit from these services for years to come – a legacy we believe Joan would have been proud of.

2003



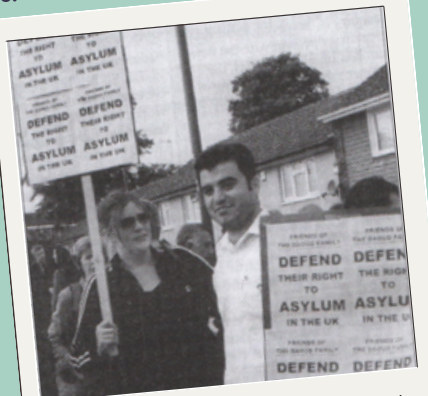
In our early days, we **campaign**ed to prevent the deportation of families, vigorously defending the human rights of those escaping oppression or conflict.

2015



Resettlement Work

In 2015 we were contracted to provide the casework for Syrians brought to the UK under the Syrian Vulnerable Persons Relocation Scheme.

2016



In 2016 we set up **Voices in Refuge**, starting to provide fully trained interpreters, many with lived experience, and delivering community interpreting training across the UK.

2020



In 2020 we celebrated our **20th anniversary**, transformed our services during Covid by moving support online, and helping those who needed us most. None of this would have been possible without our supporters' generosity.

2022

Leave a lasting gift of hope

No obligation or pressure

There's absolutely no obligation to leave a gift in your Will to Nottingham Refugee Forum. We know that including us in your Will is a big decision, and that your loved ones come first, But all gifts make a life-changing difference to individuals and families seeking sanctuary in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire.

We would be so grateful if you do decide that you would like to support Nottingham Refugee Forum in this way.

Leave a lasting impact

You can leave a specific amount of money, a percentage of your estate, or even a specific item. There are three main types of gifts:

- a. A share of your estate (residuary gift)
- b. A fixed sum of money (pecuniary gift)
- c. A specific item, such as jewellery or property

The decision of what kind of gift to leave, or whether to leave one, is entirely yours.

Recommended wording

If you prefer to include a Gift in your Will without using Farewill, this is our suggested wording.

I give free of inheritance tax to Nottingham Refugee Forum Registered Charity Number: 1121560 of Sycamore Centre, 33a Hungerhill Road, Nottingham, NG3 4NB [insert gift details, e.g. 10% of the residue of my estate] to be used for its general charitable purposes. I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer or duly authorised officer at Nottingham Refugee Forum shall be a full and sufficient discharge for my Executors.

Let us know about your intentions

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I get legal advice when writing my Will with Farewill?

Farewill makes Will writing simple by providing online and telephone services that guide you through the process. Their team of specialists check your Will for clarity and completeness. However, Farewill is not a law firm, and they don't provide individual legal advice. If you have complex circumstances – for example, detailed tax planning needs – you should speak to a solicitor. Call Farewill on **020 8050 2686** and they will let you know if your situation falls outside what their service can cover.

Do I have to use Farewill to include a gift to Nottingham Refugee Forum in my Will?

You don't need to use Farewill to leave a gift in your Will. A legacy is valid as long as it's written into a legally compliant Will. The simplest and safest way to do that is to speak with a solicitor, who can make sure the wording is correct, the Will is properly witnessed, and the gift is protected from any disputes later on. A solicitor can also advise you on tax implications and ensure the rest of your estate is structured according to your wishes.

Does Nottingham Refugee Forum pay for this?

Gifts in Wills are vital for securing our future. We provide supporters with the opportunity to write their Will for free through our partnership with Farewill. While we encourage you to consider leaving a gift, we cover the cost of the Will. Typically, the RRP of a Will is from £100.

How much money goes to supporting people seeking refuge?

For every £1 we spend, 90p goes towards the running of our services. The remaining amount goes towards our buildings and fundraising costs.

Can I update my Will later?

You can update your Will if your situation changes. Farewill provide an Update Service on their Wills online, offering unlimited free updates for the first year and £10 a year after.

How much money goes to supporting people seeking refuge?

For every £1 we spend, 90p goes towards the running of our services. The remaining amount goes towards our buildings and fundraising costs.

Can I ask for my gift to be used for a specific purpose?

We do everything we can to honour specific legacy wishes. However, we recommend wording that allows gift can be used wherever the greatest need is at that time. This means we can adapt to whatever the future holds in our work with people seeking safety in the UK.

Is it worth leaving a gift in my Will if I don't have a lot of money?

Absolutely. We are grateful for every gift, whatever the amount. Each one helps us provide the support that enables people seeking sanctuary locally to rebuild their lives.



People who have fled danger and unimaginable suffering come to the UK seeking safety, and then are faced with an asylum system that is complex, confusing and often retraumatising. The people we meet every day are our priority. We're guided and led by people lived experience, involving them in every stage of our work; from volunteering in our cafe, to working as part of our staff team to being on our board. We support those we work with to play an active part in their communities as they rebuild their lives. Together, we can build a society where everyone is welcomed and treated with fairness and compassion.
